Sunset Railroad Company was incorporated under the laws of California March 17, 1900. Sunset Western Railway Company was incorporated under the laws of California, June 18, 1908, California Civil Code titles (1) and (3) of part 4 of the first division.

Sunset Railroad Company constructed from Gosford, California, in a general southwesterly direction to Maricopa, California, a distance of about 32.75 miles and also constructed a track connection with The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company at Kern Junction, California, a distance of about .20 mile. Financed through stock and bond issues.

Sunset Western Railway Company, constructed from Pentland, California, which is located on the constructed line of the Sunset Railroad Company, in a general northwesterly direction to Shale, California, a distance of about 17.11 miles. Financed through stock and bond issues.


