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

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broad classified. With respect to their operating revenues, according to a following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For a class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

in applying this classification to any switching or terminal compa which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, t sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility re income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operatiexpenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal compan or are further classified as:

Class \$1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those perform switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class 52. Exclusively reminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnish seminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passe, ger or freight stated sto. Gyards, etc. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for reven in case a bridge or ferry; is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should not furnished under this healths.

Class S3 Both switching and priminal. Companies which perform both a switching and terminal service. The class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover be switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operators famined to bridges and ferries exclusively.

lass \$5. Mixed. Complaines performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but whe also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companion land, in addition to switching or terminal receives, those derived from local passenger traffic total freight service, carticipation in through nevenient of freight or passenger trafficulty transportation operations, and operations other than resuperfution.


