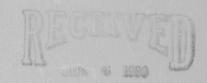
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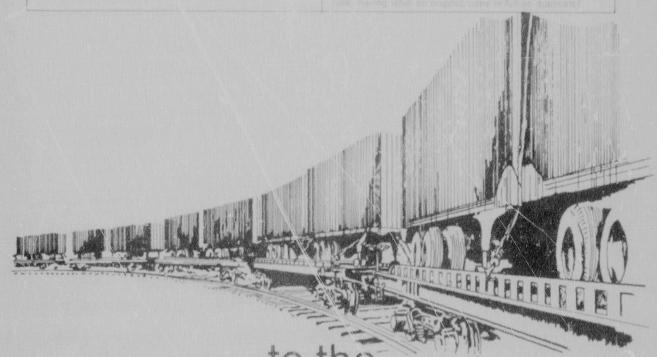

Switching and terminals companies are further classified as

Class 1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only. Such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, who her operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be include under this heading.

Class \$3. Both switching and terminal Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above
