

(8). As used in this section " " " the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor.

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts. immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. 6. Money items except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts.

7. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the Form are sent to each corporation Loncerned.

8. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating comparies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report For. A R-1 is previded

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Fores F-2 is provided

in applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated to a join, facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class SI. Exclusively switching, This class of companies includes all these performing

switching service only, whether or bond account or for revenue.

Class 52. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations stockwards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be

Class \$3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of communies includes all companies whose operations cover both terminal service, as defined above.

Class SA Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to hridges and ferries exclusively

Class \$5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passinger traffic. The revenies, this class of companies include, in addition to switching or reminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation

9. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. THE YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended Locember 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM System in Part 1201 of Title 49.
