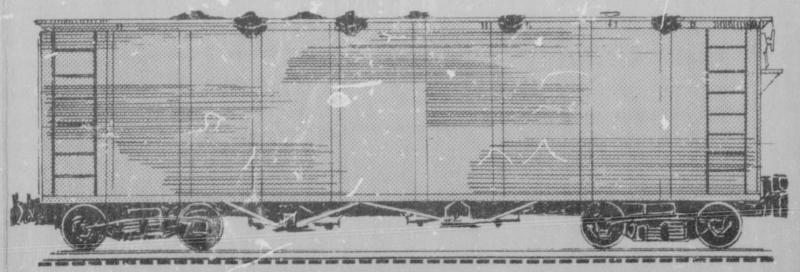

Afferent date, and shall be made out under each and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the Comm

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any faise entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. \* \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonme. for not more than two years, or both such fine and

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor. \* \* \* or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any n within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do shall forfers to the United States the num of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section \* \* \* the term "carrier" means a common carrie; subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this prit, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor.

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts. issimediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and e curately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. 8. Raiitoad corporations, nainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. Ar. operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class St. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class 52 Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations. stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for reverse. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading

Class S3. Both switching and termines. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are finned to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic.

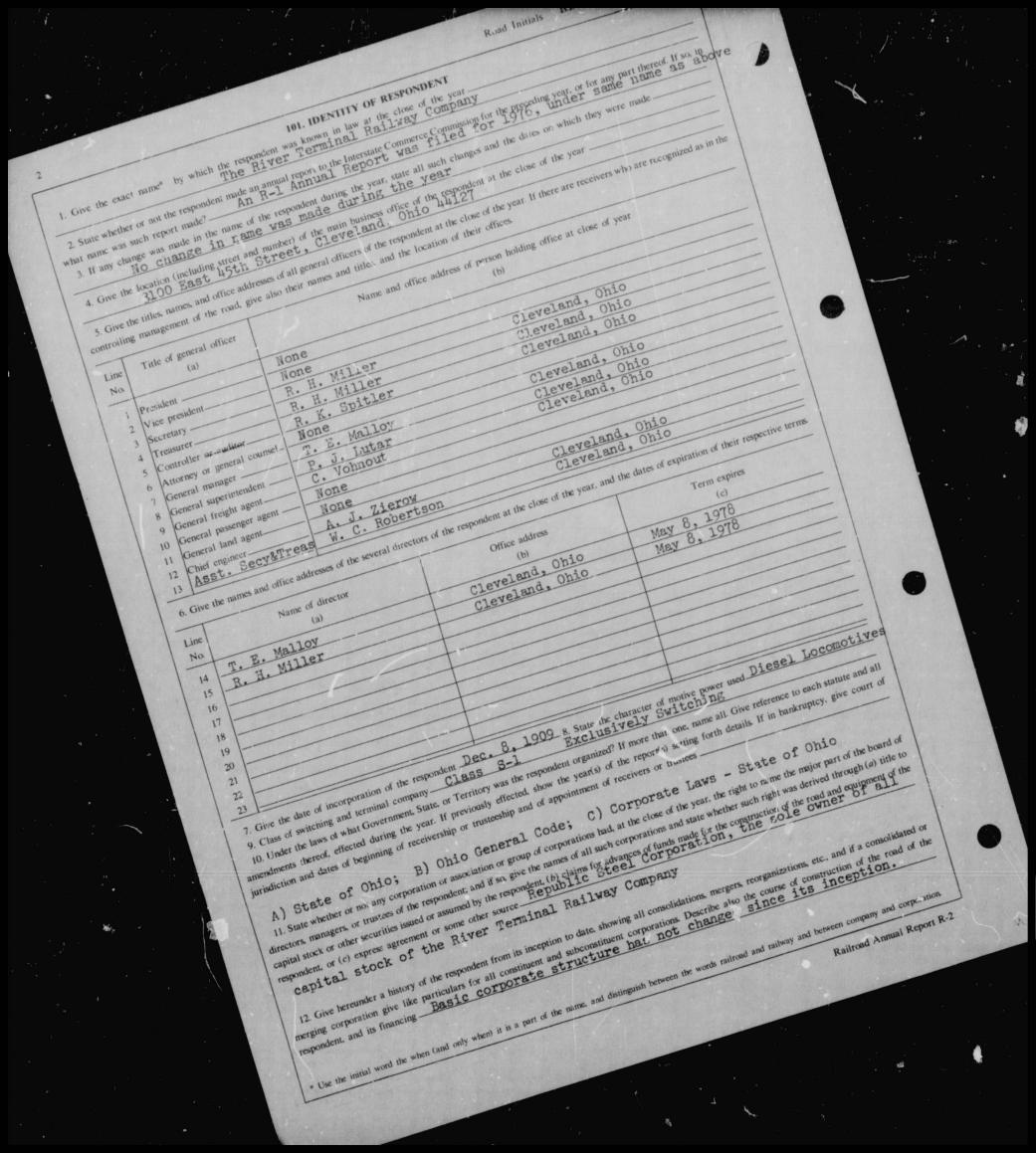

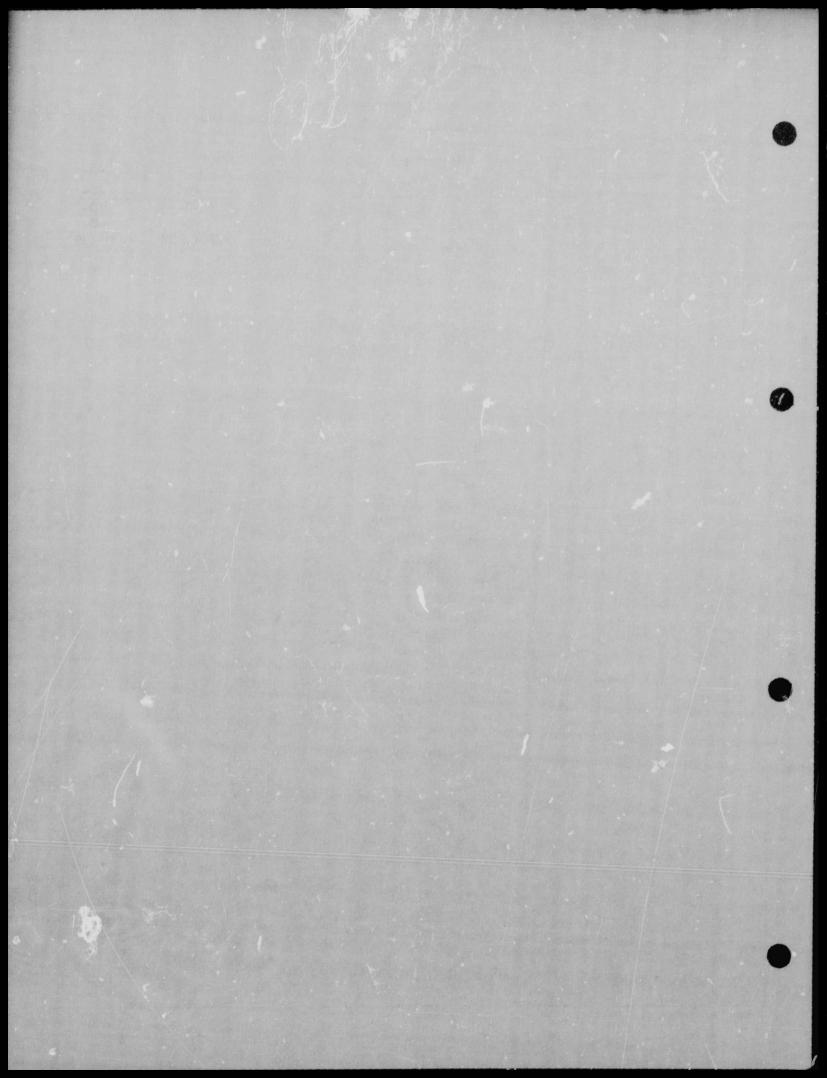

### TOTAL PENSION COSTS FOR YEAR

The River Terminal Railway Company has no procedures to account for pension funds or recording current and past service costs. This circumstance is consistant with prior years.

The River Terminal Railway Company participates as a qualified subsidiary company in the Pension Plans of Republic Steel Corporation. The Plans cover eligible hourly paid employees and eligible salaried personnel. Republic Steel Corporation administers the Plans.

The River Terminal Railway Company makes contributions to the Plans annually. The total contribution authorized and paid into the Pension Trust Funds for the year 1977, amounted to \$598,300. The amounts are based upon actuarial computations as relate to the Company's experience and circumstances and in accordance with the terms set forth in the Plans.
