The Wichita Union Terminal Railway Company was incorporated for the purpose of erecting, maintaining and operating a Union Station in the city of Wichita, Kansas and for the construction of tracks to connect the station with the tracks of the owning companies reported on Page 2, Item 11 of this return.

There has been no consolidation, merger, reorganization, etc.

The property owned by the respondent was acquired by construction which commenced in the spring of 1911 and placed in operation March 8, 1914.

The respondent was financed by the issuance of capital stock to the tennant companies and the sale to the public of first mortgage bonds. Proceeds were issued principally for purchase of property and construction of facilities.
