Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form A is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below 0,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form C is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sam of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and

terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation tions other than transportation.

8. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RE-SPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. The year means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. The BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. The PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. Twin Branch Railroad Company, a short-line common carrier railroad operating in Indiana, was incorporated under the laws of the State of Indiana on October 1, 1925. All of its common stock is owned by American Electric Power Company.

The railroad delivers coal to the Twin Branch Plant of Indiana & Michigan Electric Company from a junction point with the Penn Central Railroad. Its track is standard gauge and totals 6.12 miles, including 2.01 of main track, .70 of second track and 3.41 of passing tracks, crossovers and turnouts. It has two diesel electric locomotives.

This Annual Report has been prepared for the purpose of providing financial and statistical information concerning the Company, and not in connection with any sale, offer for sale or solicitation of an offer to buy any securities.
