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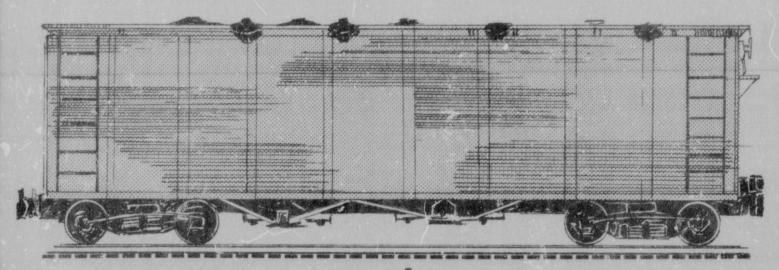

1. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part 1 of the Interstate Commerce Act:

Sec. 20. Such annual reports shall give an account of the affaits of the carrier, lessor, * * * in such form and detail as may be prescrated by the Commission.

(2) Said amount reports shall contain all the required information for the period of write months ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under oath and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless

additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and wilfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any talse entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, * * * or shall knowingly or wilfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be decored guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years or both such fine and imprisonment 8%.

(7) (c). Any cories or lessor, * 5. * or any officer, agent, employed, or representative thereof. In (ii) Pail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and tell, true, and correct answer to any question. This dirry days from the time it is fawfully required by the Commission so to do, shell fortest to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used it this section " * " the term "carried" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carder, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pape line, deased to and operated by a common carrie-

In making tenoris, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having anoual operating revenues of \$5,000.0 0 or more. For this class, Auroral Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies ate those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class Annual Report Form R.2 is provided

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant raiways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing much how service only. We like for injury account or for sevenue.

Class S2. Exclusively te rainal. This class of e-mpanies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as unum passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc. for which a clarge is made, whether operated for joint actionant or for revenue in case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it about does included under this locating.

Class \$3. Both reitebing and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both

Class 54. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is contined to those whose operations are binded to bridges and fixture exclusively.

Class 55. Mixed. Companies performing printicity a switching or a terminal cervice, but which also conduct a regular freignt or passenger radio. The research of this class of companies sociated, in addition to switching or terminal revelues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic other transportation inservices, and operations other than transportation.
