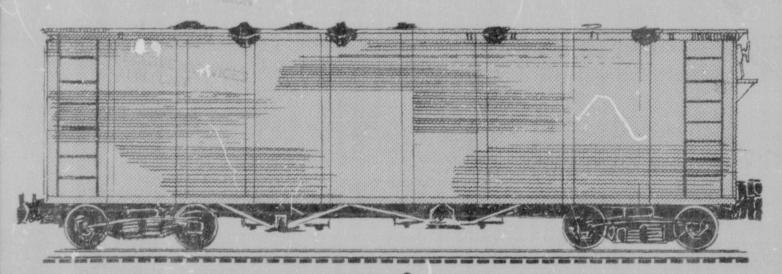

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any talse report or other document, shall be decured guilty of a mademeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such line and impresonment ***

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, * * * in any officer, agent, employee, or representative facerof, who shall full to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time faced by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to say question within thirty days from the time it is livelily required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United Stees the sum of one numbed dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a continue carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a radiroud, a water line, or a pipe line leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor * * *.*
