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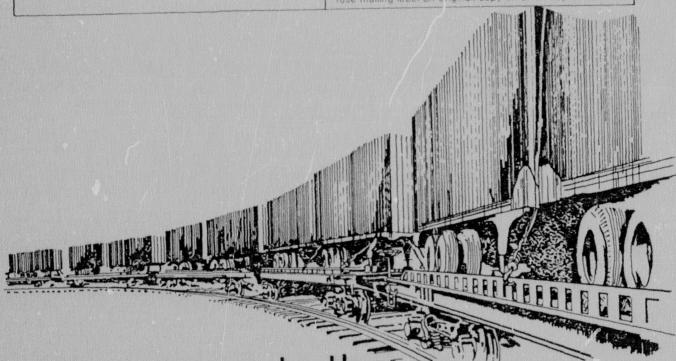

The balance sheets (Comparative Statements of Financial Position on Pages 4 and 5) and balance sheet detail on Pages 6, 11 and 12) of the Enterprise Fund of the West Virginia Railroad Maintenance Authority d/b/a South Branch Valley Rail Road as of December 31, 1978 and 1977 and the related statement of income (Results of Operations on Pages 8 and 9) for the twelve month period ended December 31, 1978 have been compiled by us.

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the basis of accounting practices prescribed or permitted by the Interstate Commerce Commission. These practices differ in some respects from generally accepted accounting principles. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements are not intended to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. This report is intended solely for filing with the Interstate Commerce Commission and is not intended for any other purpose.

A compilation is limited to presenting in the form of financial statements and supplementary data information that is the representation of management. We have not audited or reviewed the accompanying financial statements and supplementary data and, accordingly, do not express an opinion or any other form of assurance on them.

This report does not include substantially all of the disclosures required by generally accepted accounting principles. If the omitted disclosures were included in the financial statements, they might influence the user's conclusions about the Authority's Enterprise Fund financial position, results of operations, and changes in financial position.
