APPLICABLE TO COMPANIES REPORTING TO THE INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the *Interstate Commerce Commission*, *Bureau of Accounts*, Washington, D.C., 20423, by *March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made*. Attention is especially directed to the following provisions of Part III of the Interstate Commerce Act:

SEC. 11145. The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual periodical, or special reports from water carriers, lessors * * * (as defined in this section), and to prescribe, the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors * * * specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary. Such annual reports shall give an account of the affairs of the carrier, lessor * * * in such form and detail as may be prescribed by the Commission. Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of 12 months ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under oath and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within 3 months after the close of the year for which the report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the Commission. * * *

SEC. 11909. Any water carrier or other person, or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall willfully fail or refuse to make a report to the Commission as required by this part, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within 30 days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, or to keep accounts, records, and memoranda in the form and manner prescribed by the Commission, or shall willfully falsify, destroy, mutilate, or alter any report, account, record, memorandum, book, correspondence, or other document, required under this part to be kept, or who shall willfully neglect or fail to make full, true, and correct entries in such accounts, records, or memoranda of all facts and transactions as required under this part, or shall willfully keep any accounts, records, or memoranda contrary to the rules, regulations, or orders of the Commission with respect thereto, or shall knowingly and willfully file with the Commission any false report, account, record, or memorandum, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction within the district in which such offense was in whole or in part committed, be subject for each offense to a fine of not more than \$5,000. As used in this subsection, the word "keep" shall be construct to mean made, prepared, or compiled, as well as retained.

SEC. 11102. The term "water carrier" means a common carrier by water or a contract carrier by water.

SEC. 11141. As used in this section - - -the term "lessor" means a lessor of any right to operate as a water carrier; and the term "water carrier" or "lessor" includes a receiver or trustee of such water carrier, lessor, ** *.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed and each question should be answered fully and accurately, except where otherwise noted to the contrary, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like, should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form, is, because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "Not applicable; see page____, schedule (or line) number ____' should be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Where the word "none" truly and completely states the fact, it should be given as the answer to any particular inquiry or any particular portion of an inquiry. Where dates are called for, the month and day should be stated as well as the year. Customary abbreviations may be used in stating dates.

3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itself, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.

4. If it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typevitten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper, and wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached, preferably at the inner margins; attachment by pins or clips is insufficient.

5. All entries should be made in a permanent black ink, except those of a contrary character, which should be indicated in parenthesis. Items of an unusual character should be indicated by appropriate symbol and foot-

note.

6. Money items, except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footings, except Schedule 541-Freight Carried During the Year. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts.

7. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the Form are sent to each corporation concerned.

8. The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon publication, two copies of its latest printed annual report to stockholders. See page 1.

9. Water carriers are, for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission, divided into three classes in accordance with the following definitions:

Class A carriers are those carriers by water having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$506,000.

Class B carriers are those carriers by water having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$100,000 but not more than \$500,000.

Class C carriers are those carriers by water having average angual operating revenues of \$100,000 or less.

The annexed Form is prescribed for use by water carriers of Classes A and B. Class B carriers are permitted to use the condensed schedules of operating revenues and operating expenses appearing on pages 36 and 39, respectively. In other respects the requirements of the Form are identical for water carriers of both Classes A and B.

A separate Form, designated "Form W-3," is provided for water carriers of Class C.

10. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. THE YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31, of the year for which the report is made; cr. in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered bythe report. THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM SYSTEM OF ACCOUNTS means the system of accounts published as Part 1209 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended. WATER CARRIERS as referred to herein means Carriers by Inland and Coastal Waterways.

11. Should there be doubt as to the reporting of any item or items or parts thereof, or advice is desired relative to the preparation of this report, address an inquiry to the Bureau of Accounts for consideration and decision.

A report shall be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Federal Maritime Commission by every person or concern subject to the Intercoastal Shipping Act, 1933, 46 U.S.C. 843 et. seq. (except persons engaged in intrastate operations in Alaska and Hawaii) as provided in General Order No. 5, as amended, 46 C.F.R., Part 511.

The term "common carrier by water" means a common carrier by water in foreign commerce or a common carrier by water in interstate commerce on the high seas or the Great Lakes on regular routes from port to port.

SEC. 21. That the Board may require any common carrier by water, or other person subject to this Act, or any officer, receiver, trustee, lessee, agent, or employee thereof, to file with it any periodical or special report, or any account, record, rate, or charge, or any memorandum of any facts and transactions appertaining to the business of such carrier or other person subject to this Act. Such report, account, record, rate, charge, or memorandum shall be under oath whenever the Board so requires, and shall be furnished in the form and within the time prescribed by the Board. Whoever fails to file any report, account, record, rate, charge, or memorandum as required by this section shall forfeit to the United States the sum of \$100 for each day of such default. Whoever willfully falsifies, destroys, mutilates, or alters any such report, account, record, rate, charge, or memorandum or willfully files a false report, account, record, rate, charge, or memorandum shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and subject upon conviction to a fine of not more than \$1,000, or imprisonment for not more than I year, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

SCHEDULE 541. FREIGHT CARRIED DURING THE YEAR

INSTRUCTIONS

Under the Commission's order of September 13, 1963, effective January 1, 1964, all carriers by water subject to the provisions of Pacis I and III of the Interstate Commerce Act assigned to Class A and B are required to compile and report freight commodity statistics annually. Reports shall be filed in duplicate in the Bureau of Accounts. Interstate Commerce Commission. Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made.

Tonnage and revenue should be on a hilled basis. Classify the commodities carried by the respondent in its water-line and motortruck operations and for the respondent in the vessels and motortrucks of other companies (carriers) under contract, in revenue service, the domestic revenues from which are includible in accounts No. 301, "Freight revenue" and 351 "Motor-Carrier revenue" in accordance with the order of this Commission dated September 31, 1963. Maritime carriers should classify commodities the revenue from which are includible in account No. 605, "Freight-Coastwise and intercoastal". Separate the tonnage and revenue for each commodity code between "Joint raid and water traffic" and "All other traffic". The separation as to jo of raid and water traffic and all other traffic may be omitted for commodity code 471, "Small packaged freight shipments".

Include under "Joint rail and water traffic" all shipments that, so far as apparent from the information on the waybills or abstracts thereof, are being transported partly by railroad and partly by water when both are used under a common control, management, or arrangement for a continuous carriage or shipment such as traffic moving on joint rail-water and rail-motor-water rates.

Include under "All other traffe" all shipments that, so far as apparent from the information on the waybills or abstracts thereof, are transported from point of origin to point of destination solely by water, solely by truck, partly by water and partly by truck, or by any other combination which does not involve the interchanging of traffic with a railroad company, also, shipments moving on water rates when the carrier by water absorbs out of its port-to-port rates certain charges for switching, terminal, drayage, or other services within, a port terminal district.

"Passenger cars, assembled" is confined to vehicles carried as revenue freight on freight rates and does not include those carried as an adjunct to passenger business.

Fuel and stores carried on any vessel for the purpose of operating and maintaining it should not be included in this schedule.

Include under "Joint rail and water traffic" and "All other traffic", the revenues that are applicable to the tonnage.

"Gross freight revenue" means reporting carrier's gross revenue from freight without adjustment for absorption or corrections.

In the "Note" on page 55 show the extent of joint motor-water traffic included in columns (c) and (f).

Commodity codes 01 through 462 shall include shipments weighing 10,000 pounds or more. Shipments of less than 10,000 pounds of one commodity shall be reported under commodity code 471. "Small packaged freight shipments" unless the reporting carrier elects to distribute all revenue freight among the other designated classes.

"Classify" means to assign an article of freight to its appropriate commodity class which may be a 3, 4, or 5-digit number. Always classify an article in the highest digit level possible. Use a 5-digit code if the article may be properly assigned to it. If there is no applicable 5-digit code, use a 4-digit code if available. If there is no applicable 4-digit code, then the article is classified at the 3-digit level.

For a 5-digit code, report the sum of all freight classified thereunder. For a 4-digit code, report the sum of all freight classified thereunder plus the sum of all 5-digit codes where the first four digits match. For a 3-digit code, report the sum of all 4-digit code numbers where the first three digits match, plus 5-digit code numbers where the first three digits match (provided they are not included in 4-digit codes), plus any articles classified at the 3-digit level. Generally the 3-digit codes are used as summaries. The 2-digit level is a summary of 3-digit codes where the first two digits match.

Commodities must not be classified to the codes with a "T" designation. Codes at the 2 and 3 digit level followed by a "T" always are totals of the related higher level codes shown on the report form; codes not so designated may include commodities classified directly thereunder and may not total.

"Piggyback traffic" is classified in the applicable commodity code if the commodity can be identified; where the commodity cannot be identified, classify in code 461 and summarize in code 46.

Codes 44 and 441, "Freight Forwarder Traffic" includes freight traffic shipped by or consigned to any forwarder holding a permit under Part IV of the Interstate Commerce Act.

"Shipper Association or Similar Traffic" Codes 45 and 451, include freight traffic shipped by a non-profit shipper association where the commowity cannot be identified; where the commodity can be identified, classify in the applicable commodity code.

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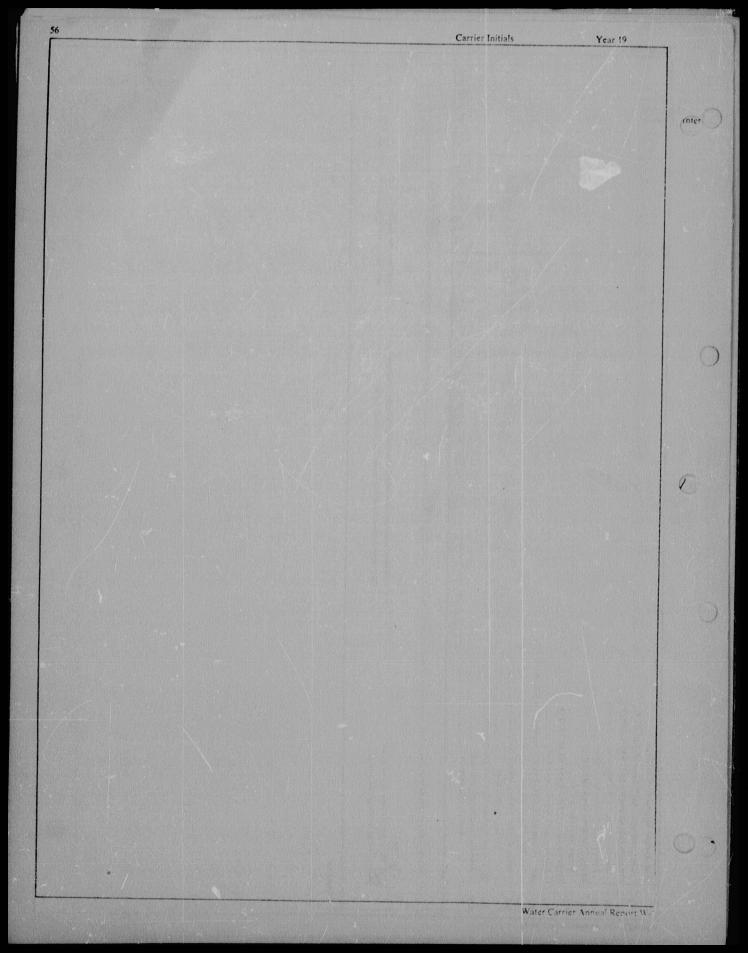
