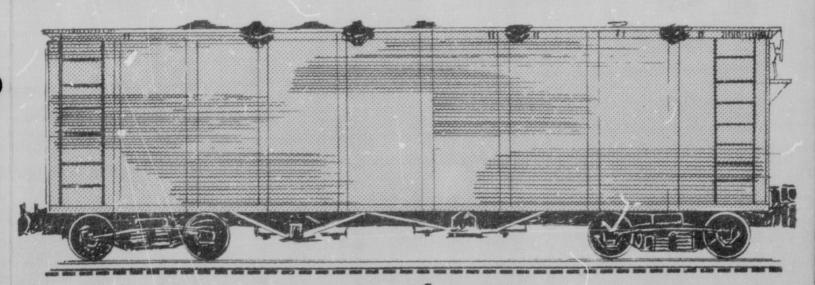

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a switching and terminal service, as defined above

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are ned to bridges and ferries exclusively

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic. ther transportation operations, and operations other than transportation
