

# NOTICE

- 1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part I of the Interstate Commerce Act:
- Sac. 20. (1) The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lessors, \* \* \* (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, \* \* \* specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, \* \* as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. Such annual reports shall give an account of the affairs of the carrier, lessor, \* \* in such form and detail as may be prescribed by the Cormission.

(2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve months ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made cut under oath and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dalars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment: \* \* \*

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, \* \* or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto, (8). As used in this section \* \* the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier; and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor, \* \* .

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to

stockholders. See schedule 350 A, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form is, because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "Not applicable; see page —, schedule (or line) number ——" should be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Where the word "none" truly and completely states the fact, it should be given as the answer to any particular inquiry or any particular portion of an inquiry. Where particular inquiry or any particular portion of an inquiry. Where dates are called for, the month and day should be stated as well as the year. Customary abbreviations may be used in stating dates.
- 3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itself, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.
- 4. If it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached, preferably at the inner margin; attachment by pins or clips is insufficient.

5. All entries should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parentheses. Items of an unusual character should be indicated by appropriate symbol and

Money items (except averages) throughout the annual report form should be shown in units of dollars adjusted to accord with footings.

- 6. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the Form are sent to each corporation concerned.
- 7. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a

lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form E.

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form A is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below 5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form C is provided. \$5,000,000.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation,

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RE-SPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. THE YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The close of the year means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. The PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM System in Part 1201 of Title 49. Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.

### HISTORY

December 22, 1883. "The Wrightsville and Sun Hill Railroad Company", Incorporated under general laws of Georgia.

January 2, 1884. Name changed to "The Wrightsville and Tennille Railroad Company", line from Tennille to Wrightsville, Georgia.

August 13, 1884. Charter amended to increase capital stock to \$70,000.00, of which \$35,000.00 was common stock and \$35,000.00 was preferred stock.

December 1, 1886. Absorbed by consolidation, "The Dublin and Wrightsville Railroad Company" owning a line from Dublin to Wrightsville, Georgia.

December 10, 1886. The charter was amended increasing the capital stock to \$140,000.00, of which \$70,000.00 was common and \$70,000.00 preferred stock.

April 21, 1890. Charter amended to extend the road across Oconee River at or near Dublin through the counties of Laurens and Dodge to or near Abbeville, Georgia.

February 1, 1899. Purchased from "Oconee and Western Railroad Company", the line from Dublin to Hawkinsville, Georgia. February 9, 1899, charter amended accordingly, and capital stock increased to \$300,000.00.

July 1, 1906. Purchased from "Dublin and Southwestern Railroad Company", the line from Dublin to Eastman, Georgia.

August 8, 1907. Absorbed by consolidation, "Dublin and Southwestern Railroad Company", and name of consolidation made to read "Wrightsville and Tennille Railroad Company". Charter amended to increase capital stock to \$600,000.00.

January 29, 1929. Charter amended to change the principal place of business of the company to Savannah, Georgia.

May 5, 1933. Charter was amended renewing it for fifty years from December 22, 1933.
