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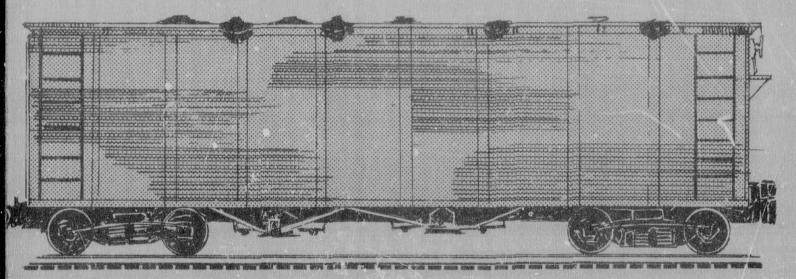

One copy should be retained in respondent's files. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part I of the Interstate Commerce Act:

SEC 30. (1) The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lessors, * * * (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, * * * specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, * * * as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. (7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under this section to be filed, * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeancy and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment: * * * (7) (c) Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other, report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within the days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfier to the United states the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in defau SEC. 10. (1) The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special re-orts from carriers, lessors, * * * (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier; and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject this example of such loss or . * * *

to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor,

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See schedule 108, page 6.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general defini-

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000. or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railroads, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

- Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.
- Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading
- Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.
- Class S4. Bridge and lerry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.
- Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation
- 8. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. Respondent means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. The YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM SYSTEM OF ACCOUNTS FOR RAILROAD COMPANIES means the system of accounts in Part 1201 of Title 49. Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.

Non-contributory pension provisions cover substantially all the employees and, in addition, participating salaried employees are also covered by the contributory pension provisions.

Pension costs are determined by an independent actuary based upon an acceptable actuarial method and various actuarial factors which, from time to time, are adjusted in light of actual experience. Effective July 1, 1975, the accrued benefit cost method (unit credit) was adopted under which pension costs reflect current service and a 25-year amortization of unfunded past service. Concurrently, a funding policy was adopted which provides that payments to the pension trust shall be equal to the minimum funding requirements of ERISA plus additional amounts that may be approved from time to time.

Prior to July, 1975, pension costs were determined by an actuarial method under which current and past service costs were combined and funded over the remaining service of employees -- on the average less than 15 years.

Pension costs were \$216,056 in 1976 and \$186,414 in 1975.
