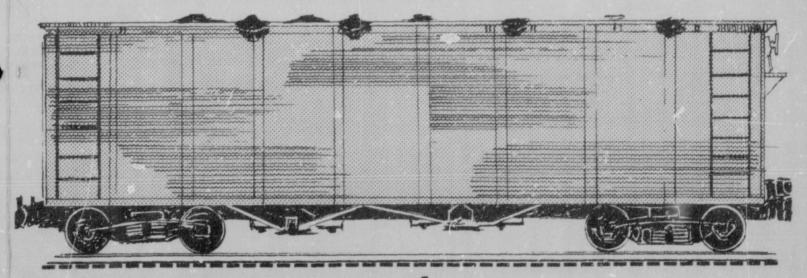

The Pittsburgh, Lisbon and Western Railroad was incorporated under the laws of Pennsylvania on November 11, 1902, and of Ohio November 12, 1902, being a consolidation of the Shenango and Beaver Valley Railroad Company and The Pittsburgh, Lisbon and Western Railroad Company.

Respondent carried a service interruption policy with the Imperial Insurance Company, Ltd., under which it will be entitled to indemnity for certain work stoppage losses. In the event such losses are sustained by other railroads holding similar policies, respondent may be obligated to pay additional premiums.

- Item 1(c) The Pittsburgh and Lake Erie Railroad Company acquired 100% ownership of the Youngstown and Southern Railway Company through purchase of the Montour Railroad Company on April 1, 1975. Prior to this date, the P&LR RR. Co. controlled 50%. Therefore, this Investment Tax Credit, Allocated.
- Item 1(d) This Investment Tax Credit will only be used to offset any further
 Tax Liabilities of the Youngstown and Southern Railway Company.
 This represents a Carry Forward Investment Credit figure
 accumulated prior to April 1, 1975. The Investment Tax Credit for
 periods subsequent to April 1, 1975 will be used by the P&LE RR. Co.
- Them 1(f) This deduction due to Amortization of Grading and Tunnel Bores was used by the parent company P&LE RR. Co., who acquired 100% ownership on April 1, 1975.
- The Pittsburgh and Lake Erie Railroad Company acquired 100% ownership of the Youngstown and Southern Railway Company on April 1, 1975, therefore 75.34% of the Youngstown and Southern's 1975 loss was used to offset P&LE RR. Income in 1975. Any Carry Forward Loss prior to April 1, 1975 can only be used to offset future gains of the Youngstonw & Southern Railway Company. It cannot be used to reduce P&LE RR. Co. Taxable Income under the "Tas Atlocation Agreement". This is due to the P&LE RR. Co. controlling only 50% of the stock prior to April 1, 1975.

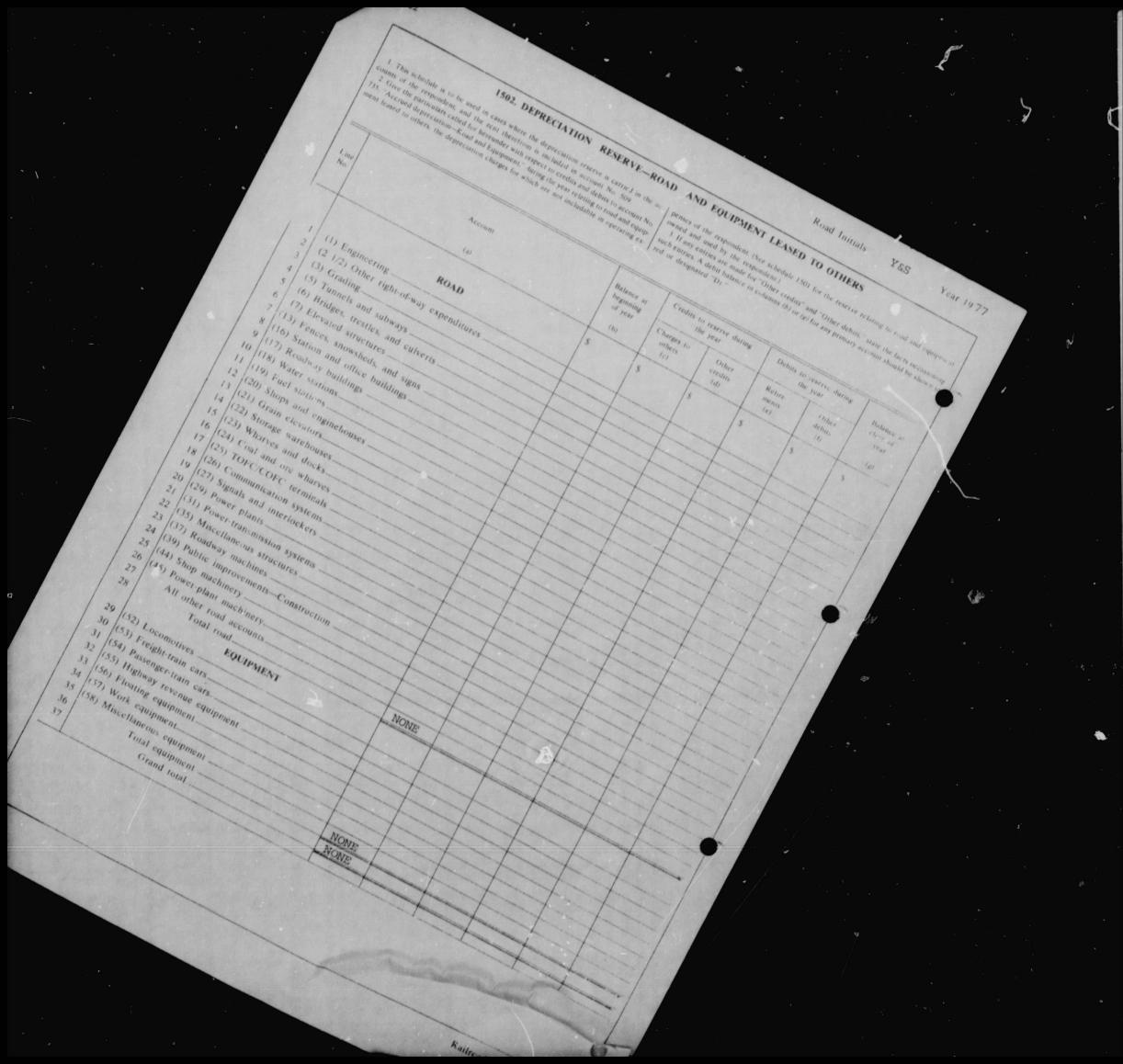

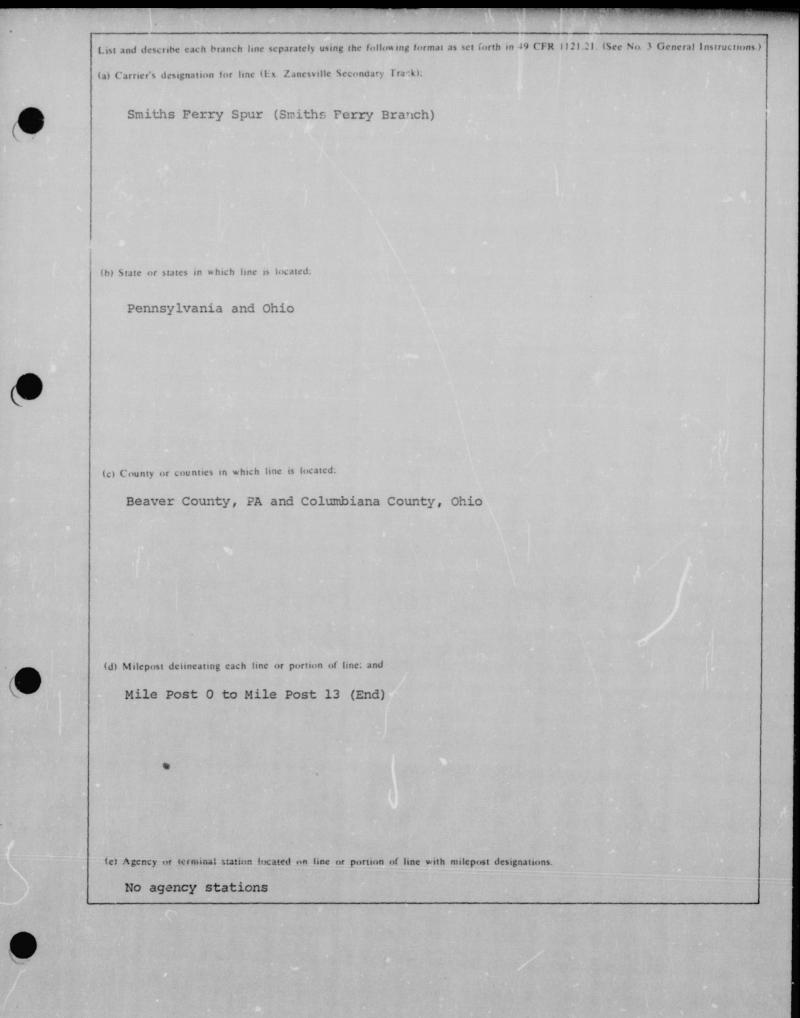

- 4. Reports should be filled out in triplicat: and the original and one copy should be returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D. C. 20423. The other copy should be retained in respondents' files. Figures should be reported in whole dollars.

Copies of the report shall be filed with and made available for public inspection at the Commission's field offices in the state or states in which the branch line is situated. Addresses of field offices enclosed.

5. Records, accounts, working papers, and other documents reflecting the revenue, cost and service unit data for each branch line for which the railroad must maintain data shall be made available for inspection and examination by the Commission and for lines situated within it state, by the designated state agency at a time and place mutually agreeable to the parties. The railroad shall also reproduce such records for the designated state agency, provided the agency pays the reasonable cost thereof.
