Dear Chairman Miller and Vice Chairman Begeman:

I am writing to provide comment on the service data that we are filing contemporaneous herewith in response to the Board's data collection order of October 8, 2014.

CP's US network continues to be fluid and in good operating condition, as it has for months. Again this week, system average train speed, weekly average terminal dwell, and cars on line data are all good.

Our outstanding grain car orders remain at zero this reporting week, as they have for the previous sixteen weeks. We spotted a total of 1166 grain cars this week, which total includes single cars and cars in dedicated trains, and we received 380 new grain car orders. From a grain order perspective, we continue to be current in the United States.

The Rapid City, Pierre & Eastern Railroad (RCP&E) requested five grain cars this week, and we delivered five grain cars to them. On average there was a plus one CP/RCP&E locomotive balance this reporting week, meaning there was one more CP locomotive on RCP&E than RCP&E locomotives on CP.
