Dear Mr. Elliott, Ms Begeman and Ms Miller:

I am writing to provide comment on the service data that we are filing contemporaneous herewith in response to the Board's data collection order of October 8, 2014.

CP's US network continues to be fluid and in good operating condition, as it has for months. Again this week, system average train speed, weekly average terminal dwell, and cars on line data are all good.

The number of outstanding grain car orders returned to zero this reporting week, which is where it has stood for twenty two of the last twenty three weeks. We spotted a total of 2319 grain cars this week, which total includes single cars and cars in dedicated trains, and we received 1605 new grain car orders.

The Rapid City, Pierre & Eastern Railroad (RCP&E) requested five grain cars this week, and we fulfilled that request. On average there was a minus two CP/RCP&E locomotive balance this reporting week, meaning there were two more RCP&E locomotives on CP than CP locomotives on RCP&E.
