Dear Mr. Elliott, Ms Begeman and Ms Miller:

I am writing to provide comment on the service data that we are filing contemporaneous herewith in response to the Board's data collection order of October 8, 2014.

CP's US network continues to be fluid and in good operating condition, as it has for months. Again this week, system average train speed, weekly average terminal dwell, and cars on line data are all good.

The number of outstanding grain car orders is again at zero this reporting week, as it has been for all but three of the last 33 weeks. We spotted a total of 1676 grain cars this week, which total includes single cars and cars in dedicated trains, and we received 1170 new grain car orders. From a grain order perspective, we continue to be current in the United States.

The Rapid City, Pierre & Eastern Railroad (RCP&E) did not request any grain cars this week. There was a minus three CP/RCP&E average locomotive balance this reporting week, meaning that on average there were three more RCP&E locomotives on CP than CP locomotives on RCP&E.
