I am writing to provide comment on the service data that we are filing contemporaneous herewith in response to the Board's data collection order of October 8, 2014.

CP's US network continues to be fluid and in good operating condition, as it has for many months. System average train speed, weekly average terminal dwell, and cars on line data are all good.

This reporting week we received 168 new grain car orders, and spotted a total of 1512 grain cars, which total includes single cars and cars in dedicated trains. The number of outstanding grain car orders this week is 2490.

An off-line washout derailment in the Pacific Northwest has affected our grain car cycles in that corridor. We are working with other carriers and our customers to minimize the effects and improve cycle times.
